Planning Considerations



Mitigation Measures to Consider:

- Increased staffing for PD, FD, Dispatch, EOC, EMS and Hospital
- Situational Awareness before, during and after the event
- Message Boards for communications
- Temporary Traffic Lights for known choke points
- Designated Viewing Areas
- Trash/Rubbish, dumpsters and trash containers at high density viewing areas
- · Redundant emergency communications
- Public Messaging, Townhall Mtgs, Social Media



Planning Considerations



Challenges:

- Large crowds
- · Booked hotels, short term rentals, RV parks
- Traffic Congestion / Choke Points / Key Intersections
- Vehicle Accidents / Stalled Motorists
- Medical Emergencies
- Access for EMS vehicles
- Fuel Shortages
- Communication Problems (LTE and 5G Networks)
- Overwhelmed Dispatch / EOC
- School Closure
- Wildfires

Planning Considerations



Transportation Considerations:

- Avoid last minute and unnecessary travel on roadways
- Be prepared for heavy traffic and delays
- Pre-position resources if possible
- Travelers will stop on all roadways to view the Eclipse
- · Lakes will be popular and probably crowded for viewing
- Airports will be popular with fly-ins for the Eclipse
- Pilots may try to camp with their planes
- · Taxiways may become overflow parking

Law Enforcement Considerations:

- Human Trafficking
 - Traffickers follow the people, money and large crowds
- Alcohol
 - Alcohol consumption is significantly higher during this kind of event
- Illegal Drug Use
 - Drug use is significantly higher during this kind of event
- Active Shooter / Domestic Terrorism
- Civil Unrest


Planning Considerations



Private Property:

- Allowed to sell day parking on unimproved surfaces
- Overnight camping is prohibited (in city limits)
- Toilet access is a problem in high density locations
- · Trash collection and removal






What to Expect



- · Gridlock traffic before, during and after the eclipse. Partial begins at 12:22 p.m. and ends at 3:02 p.m. Totality takes place at 1:40 p.m.
- Sanitation routes will not run and City Hall will be closed.
- Ennis ISD will be closed.
 - The City of Ennis will provide Ennis ISD with an educational packet for all students along with protective eye wear to experience the eclipse. Glasses will also be provided to the Boys and Girls Club.

- Check appointments and avoid April 8th if possible.






- Coordinate traffic control for large scale evacuation
- Help establish, maintain and share situational awareness
- · Simplify information analysis and verification
- Request assistance from State or other external sources

 - Open center at old fire station from 8am 4pm for unsheltered neighbors to have a "safe" place / connection point with EC staff due to the overwhelming number of people in town.
 - Distribute eclipse glasses to unsheltered and anyone that reaches out to EC leading up to the event.
- Monday, April 8th-
 - Center can serve as a hospitality space for all city crews / employees the day of the event. Hydration station, breakfast, lunch, bathroom break, etc...

- To cut down on patrons trying to physically reach the library, no items will be due on April 6th-8th, and no fines will accrue
- Library has 5055 eclipse glasses to give away for free beginning March 18th
- Library will give away approx. 300 mini buttons with eclipse logo the week before eclipse
- Friends of the Library group interested in hosting a concession stand outside the library's Crockett St. door
- Library & Public Parking Lot will be for staff, merchants and nearby residents.
- Museum continue regular business hours: Saturday (10-4), Sunday (1-4), and Monday (CLOSED)

Overview: Jim Wehmeier

- Securing airport for pilot (fly-in) viewing only
- Addition of Toilettes at airport for transient pilots
- Pre-determine maximum number of transient aircraft that can be safely accommodated
- Restricting home-based aircraft to "Necessary" operations on that day
- Publish NOTAMS regaring expectation of heavy traffic and limited availability of apron
- Prepare to file a NOTAMS closing airstrip upon reaching capacity
- · Notify home based aircraft of possibility of airfield closure on that day

Parks Plan



Overview: Paul Liska

- City Parks will be open, parking will be managed with barricades to close off entry once full.
 - Rotary, Veterans, Bluebonnet, Lions, Rogers and Maise, Lake Clark
- Pedestrian traffic welcome in all areas.
- Soccer and baseball groups will be notified to cancel all activities that day. They may open concessions.
- Parks Staff will be divided in 2/3 people groups at larger Community Park sites.
 - Rotary Park, Bluebonnet Park, Veterans Park, Rogers & Maise Park.
- Signage / temporary barricades at
 - Lions, IOOF, Kiwanis, Lake Clark Park to prevent parking on grass. (may staff if other departments have available personnel.)
- Parks Staff will assume they will be "stuck" onsite the entire day, so will have all supplies needed to manage restrooms, trash, communications, first aid and traffic control.
